

A TRIP TO MOCA

Collage artists might find inspiration in two exhibits at the Museum of Contemporary Art in Los Angeles. "One Day at a Time: Manny Farber and Termite Art" (through March 11) feels like both an antidote and a reflection of our quick-view, aggrandized, non-material times. It promotes multitudes of ordinary things, everyday minute experiences, and the discarded. This show centers around the colorful work of Manny Farber. It also, with great deliberateness by curator Helen Molesworth, incorporates many other artists who work with similar themes. The group show seems a little like a collage itself.



of art. The artist/"deejay"/"curator" is a shopowner and makes compelling visions from arrangements of objects.






Maurice Harris, *Protect my Opulence* An audacious flower arrangement using unusual combinations of materials, Including cotton, pearls, and heliconia

Rachel Rose, *Lake Valley*, 2016 This HD animated video is greener and richer than a sorry cellphone can record. Collagelike layering drives much of the motion. The artist uses many different digitized found images supplemented by drawing. At the Geffen Contemporary is a mid-career retrospective of Laura Owens. She combines lush brushy strokes of paint, digital printing, bad painting, sewing, collage, and other unexpected methods to make both abstracted and lowbrow artworks. She often works very large with gutsy jarring elements.




