

"Raising awareness through art is like alchemy"





Gerald Brommer passed away November 3 at age 93. As an artist he was a multifaceted master of painting technique, particularly watercolor, and he often incorporated collage into his work. Although his images were quite traditional, he gave quick, insightful, and genial critiques of collage, with a contemporary point of view. He was a juror for CAA art shows, workshop leader, and mentor to many in the San Fernando Valley's art community. He taught high school art for 26 years, wrote over 27 books for artists and produced over 14 art videos. He and his wife traveled the world, which provided inspiration for most of his paintings. They had many friends in the education and art community, for which they were forever grateful. There have been major awards from the National Watercolor Society (NWS) and the American Watercolor Society (AWS) as well as art organizations around the world. He is survived by his wife, Georgia, to whom he was married 70 years..




CURATING COLLAGE—QUESTIONS AND CONCEPTS

Kolaj Magazine put on a virtual workshop, "Curating Collage," in conjunction with the University of Vermont's Fleming Museum of Art. The role of the curator in CAA's own exhibits has been discussed at board meetings the last couple of years. So here are excerpts from Kolaj Magazine's promo material. Interesting questions are raised in an era where the person putting it all together (think DJs and collage artists themselves) holds as much sway as individual artists.

"Curating is a vital part of art's function: a curator creates a bridge between artwork and audience. For artists, this process can be confusing and mysterious. The goal of the Curating Collage Workshop is to equip artists with the tools to curate their own work, to work with curators, and build exhibitions that connect with diverse audiences.

The Curating Collage Workshop will focus on the role of the exhibition: How do we exhibit collage? What is needed from collage to function in a commercial gallery, art center, or museum? How do we build exhibitions that go beyond the "Cut and Paste" group show model that is prevalent today? What does it mean to be artist-centric, medium-centric, or viewer-centric in the presentation of collage in exhibition? And the workshop will explore ideas around Curation: What is a curator and what is their role? How do we introduce collage to viewers? How do we build an audience for collage and generate enthusiasm and a sense of value for the work? How do we take collage where it needs to go to reach the viewers it is intended to reach?"



She exhibited works on paper, mixed media collages, and acrylic encaustic paintings. The show contrasted work created pre-Covid with works created afterwards during a period of isolation in a temporary studio in her second bedroom. She was told not to return to her studio building so she moved her supplies during several weeks in April and May. She managed to work on a 40 inch round table, and reorganized and repurposed the desk, small sofa and bookcase shelves in the small space.




Barbara Tabachnick, *Serentipity*, encaustic monotype with ink on rice paper, 10 x 8, for "Wild World"
