

# FEATURED SPEAKER ALVARO SÁNCHEZ




Alvaro Sánchez zoomed with us from Guatemala. He has found a spiritual headquarters in San Francisco California, where there are many collage and mixed media artists. A one-person exhibit (ending June 15 2021) in Warsaw Poland at the Retroavangarda Gallery and has extended his international outreach. A communications and advertising major in college, his early employment as a graphic designer led him to informal fine art tutoring from his colleagues.

Mr. Sánchez works in both analog and digital formats (Adobe Photoshop and Illustrator often using photos or scans of vintage graphics), but wants his digital work to retain a feeling of the handmade. He recently returned to digital work during the pandemic when the lockdown made materials like paper scarce. An advantage of digital work is total control over the image.



He proceeds intuitively with his work with no specific starting concept. His influences include dada, art brut, and outsider art, and he loves the beauty when an artist lets things go and you get maps from inside a strange mind.

There is an attraction to the eeriness of old medical illustrations and he combines them with ink, charcoal and other old paper.

In Witnesses, the artist used Sennelier oil pastel with the collage and he loves the creamy crayon texture.


Other influences include gestural artists like Cy Twombly and Robert Rauchenburg. There is also the CoBrA movement of midtwentieth century Copenhagen and the low countries, which advocated freedom and experimentation with inspiration form primitive and children's art.

Mr. Sánchez likes to experiment with color, taking cues from his nephew and niece who use random colors. He doesn't worry if the colors "don't go." Instead the result must appeal to his eyes.

He has lately used violent brush strokes to make his work and says that going to his studio is like going into the ring, fighting the canvas or paper.

Helmet was made with random brushstrokes, and then from the shapes an image emerged. The artist let the canvas talk to him.

Some of the latest works have been large scale collages on watercolor paper. Working big is a new challenge. He wants to take collage to the ultimate consequence, going beyond cut-and-paste. To that end he has recently incorporated oil pastel crayons.

Alvaro Sanchez is currently trying to make collage a larger part of Guatemalan art, which now includes a lot of installation or traditional paintings.





His personal and humanistic work is included in over 160 prestigious art collections worldwide. His images have also appeared in over 50 books and catalogues, as well as numerous articles and reviews in art magazines, periodicals and newspapers. La Monte's work is focused on his political and humorous perceptions of his African American life experience. He uses Pop Icons such as watermelons, Uncle Ben, and Aunt Jemima that represent black imagery and illustrate racial stereotypes from both the past and present.

Nancy Nikkal. Split Personality. The artist uses layers and painted paper, and worked the front and back of the piece; she says all art is all about touch.





Shawn K. Riley. *Remnants of Memory.* She used vintage silk embroidery and scans of the remnants of the artists' own jeans stitchery from high school.

Lucy Hale. *Kitchen Lessons: Heirloom Recipe for Grief.* Influenced by growing up the mid-century deep south with a pernicious code of silence, the artist transformed the tablecloth design by felt tip pen from cheerless flowers to maniacal grieving faces.

Lauren Rechner. Louder Long Beach. This digital collage incorporates photos of street art and an upside down ghost and is done in recognition of Black Lives Matter.





Kwei-lin Lum, *Phoenix Alights*. In this digital collage, *a*n Asian-American woman, weighted down by ancient restrictions, has a liberating vision.



Esther Pearlman. You Said What About My Hair. The artist loves comedy and uses various items that she's collected over the years.




Sharon Santillo. Walking to the Moonlight School. To solve literacy issues in Kentucky in 1911, a woman school superintendent opened night schools and started a popular model for adult education.



Elaine Langerman – Brooklyn Museum Sketchbook Project. The artist filled pages with a variety of surreal digital collages and invited the viewer to discover for themselves what the stories are.





Susanne Belcher, *Homecoming*. From a series *Coming Together Again*, where the artist incorporated vintage fabric, found objects, and altered paper into her traveling squares and pods.

Susan Gesundheit, Godzilla Grid. The background was old poster paper painted with housepaint; fabric and a Godzilla were added on top.



Barbara Schwartz, Time to Go Home She mainly used cocktail napkins, which give the piece an airy ethereal look.



Maria Strmsek, Letter Sent This piece reminds the artist of a letter that's been lost, and she made it from books and papers that she created.

## **TIPS AND TRICKS**



Lucie Hinden, Cache Cache

Primarily a painter, the artist detoured into collaging, puzzle-like, with fabric. She has techniques to help soften the fabric, making it easier to glue without the fabrics becoming too stiff if they're painted on. "To soften painted fabrics for collage you can either 1. Mix 1 part Golden Gac 900 with one part of the acrylic color you are using. Once the fabric is totally dry, you then must iron it at least 3 minutes. You will feel it soften. 2. You can also use Liquitex Fabric Medium instead of the Gac 900 and let it dry, then collage. The only drawback is that the Liquitex Fabric Medium is not always easy to find. You can also paint right on the collaged fabric, and I do that, too, but I only do it to adjust the colors at the end of the process. I prefer to experiment with coloring the fabrics first."

This is the Michaels.com writeup about Gac 900 Fabric Medium -This special medium from Golden is designed to modify paints for use on fabric and clothing. A heat-setting medium, it's suitable for brushing, airbrushing or screen-printing, and it offers a soft, pliable feel that provides laundering stability—it can even be added to airbrush colors for tie-dye effects!



"What kept me sane [during the pandemic] was reconnecting with women who I went to high school with (1964-68) in Philadelphia. It all began with Zoom visits last May and eventually we decided to write stories that we intended to only share with one another... and then something quite incredible happened! What started out as a handful of us writing, turned into 43 of us! The essays are as varied as the women . . . So we decided to turn our stories into a book! 'Unmute Yourself, Girlfriend' . . .

Our alma mater, the Philadelphia High School for Girls (founded in 1848) will be the beneficiary of the profits from the sale of the book. We have set up a scholarship fund - and well, it has truly been an incredible journey that hopefully will continue as we hand many of these bright, but under privileged girls scholarships."
