Influenced by the works of Romare Bearden, **La Monte Eugene Westmoreland** has been an active artist for the past forty years. His personal and humanistic work is included in over 160 prestigious art collections worldwide. His images have also appeared in over 50 books and catalogues, as well as numerous articles and reviews in art magazines, periodicals and newspapers. La Monte's work is focused on his political and humorous perceptions of his African American life experience. He uses Pop Icons such as watermelons, Uncle Ben, and Aunt Jemima that represent black imagery and illustrate racial stereotypes from both the past and present.



WHAT WE HIDE: Exploring Hidden Disability and Identity shines a light on what society often says should be kept secret. This series is working to eliminate the stigma and shame of what is invisible to an often ableist, cisgendered and unrelentingly discriminatory society.

What are you hiding? What mask do you wear? What version of yourself do you present to the world?



The masks in the exhibition represent our inner and outer personas; the person we are in the outside world and the person we keep hidden. In many pieces I use string to link elements together; the string reflects the connectedness and interaction of thoughts, of people, of ideas, and of memories and experiences. Often my art doesn't feel complete until I weave it together at the very end.

Nancy is a member of the Silvermine Guild.

"I...wrote about this work and used the image in a class I teach to demonstrate how to select fabric and papers for a collage, then embellish with Prismacolor pencils. I teach adult women at the Pelham Art Center, Pelham, NY. I say collage is always about layers, texture and color. I used thin rice papers in this collage and you can see how the layers overlap."

[The piece above is] from an ongoing series of what I call "collage paintings" because although I begin with collage -- a wonderfully free medium that invites spontaneity and random occurrence -- I paint and draw over the collages to help unify them and highlight certain passages. I may also create passages of painted surface. My work is not ABOUT anything, however – it tells no story, sends no message. It is inspired by the ephemera I find as well as what I am thinking about; then it's the viewer's spin.




Jean Hess, Thread Map, 14 x 16




