

FEATURED SPEAKER: TODD BARTEL



Todd Bartel earned an MFA in Painting from Carnegie Mellon University in 1993. His work assumes the forms of painting, drawing, and sculpture in a collage and assemblage format. His work investigates the interconnected histories of collage and landscape and the roles of nature and natural resources in Western culture. Bartel teaches drawing, painting, collage, assemblage, conceptual art, and installation art at The Cambridge School of Weston, Weston, MA.

"Regarding the "Witness Series" [an example is below], the overall process yields two separate collages that initially appear unsuitable to be near one another—until it is realized the exchanged parts came from each other. I always show both parts together as unexpected diptychs."


YUPO PAPER, INK, AND SARAN WRAP

From your workshop chair, Barbara: Once again, dear CAA, wishing you a Happy New Year!

Hopefully, I can bring you new ideas to use. This project is simple and fun. You will need Yupo Paper (which can be purchased on Amazon) or even the slick side of photo paper. You need any color(s) of acrylic inks, alcohol inks, and crumbled Saran Wrap (this could be optional).

To experiment, you do not have to purchase many inks. First pour random colors of acrylic ink any place on the paper. You can stir it or leave in place. You can drip as well. As soon as possible before it dries place droplets on top. You will notice the chemicals unite! Gorgeous. Then for texture, I crumble Saran Wrap and place on top. Push down. Let dry! You can use as backdrop for collage, add tissue, etc.



This has been a year of high anxiety, and the news media have hardly helped! To be contrary, as a sort of self-soothing exercise, I created this collage by taking only positive words from one issue of The Wall Street Journal.

I combined them on white paper, then did a negative scan so the white letters stood out on a black background. I then cut them up and re-applied to a monochrome image of a starry sky. The colorful urn and floating gems are a mixed-message about – oh – funerary imagery and celebration. They break the black-and-white monotony with a bit of mischief!










Monochromatic: One color, Infinite possibilities

Monochromatic color schemes are derived from a single base hue and extended using its shades, tones and tints. For example, in the Blue spectrum we have Azure, Cobalt, Cerulean, Ultramarine, etc. Reds might include Garnet, Crimson, Rose...the possibilities for explorations within each hue are endless. How expressive can you be utilizing a **single base hue**? For inspiration, consider a few well-known artists who explored the possibilities of working in monochrome: Agnes Martin, Mark Rothko and Gerhard Richter.
