# WINNERS OF "INTERNAL DIALOGUES"

FIRST PLACE
Melinda Fine, Entropy, 30x20, cut paper collage

Melinda Fine depicted the tension between inspiration and execution of the ideas (making them happen), She was inspired by the David Byrne quote "Things fall apart, it's scientific." Jim Morphesis found the piece both powerful and meticulous.



SECOND PLACE
Sharmon Davidson, Angel of the Crossroads
14x14, analogue collage

Sharmon Davidson imagined an angel who helps make decisions at a crossroads. She used a red monotype, pages from an old bible, tic tac toes from an old engineering book, and train tracks from a vintage magazine.



THIRD PLACE
Peter Knapp, And It Seems Like It Was Only Yesterday...
20x20, Mixed Media and Collage

Peter Knapp has a printmaking past. He used elements from prints that didn't work out and merged them with ink, paint, and pencil. This process represents a new direction for him.



CAROLANN WATTERSON AWARD P.K. Williams, *Simple Solutions #1* 24x24, mixed media collage on panel

P.K. (Patricia) Williams thought about politics and the repercussions of solutions. Here she says that simple solutions aren't simple at all. She used a layering process and loves patterns.




HONORABLE MENTION #1 Evelyn Rapin, *Plants Music Peace with Three Nightingales* 44x30, Mixed Media

Evelyn Rapin used symbols of peace and harmony, which morphed into an anti-war statement. There are three nightingales, the national bird of Ukraine.



HONORABLE MENTION #2 Li Newton, *Imagine* 36x24, Mixed Media

Jim Morphesis found this very large piece dazzling and commented on the large amount of work involved, and the varied cut out techniques used by the artist.



HONORABLE MENTION #3 Susanne Belcher, Sprung Loose and Disconnected 15x6, Assemblage

Susanne Belcher had fun making this piece. She used a bedspring, film, and selfies. Springing loose is a way to deal with the tensions over recent world events.



HONORABLE MENTION #4
Denise Cerro, *Down The Rabbit Hole*24x24, Mixed Media

For this piece, the artist found an excuse to layer papers, a process which she loves. The title came to her as she was working. She worked on cradle board, which was amenable to her scrubbing, scratching, and washing. The rabbit is in the center. Jim Morphesis liked the painterly look.


# **JUROR: JIM MORPHESIS**



Jim Morphesis joined CAA for the "Internal Dialogues" reception on November 5 and provided much support for the selected works. He was very impressed by the 303 high-quality pieces that were submitted and chose 106 for the show. He spent a lot of time looking at each piece, about five times per piece, sometimes using a magnifying glass. He found the accompanying comments from the artists very helpful. Ultimately he tried to include as many pieces as possible. His group of winners intentionally reflected the diversity of approaches and ideas that were chosen for the show.






