





JUROR'S STATEMENT

First I viewed all the entries a few times. So I knew all the entries.Then I made the selections.I ended up with 100 pieces.The committee told me I should choose 80 pieces.

So I tried again, for artists who received two pieces, I tried to select one. I ended up with 91 pieces.

The selection of awards frustrated me, because there were so many excellent art pieces. I struggled for 2 whole days. Finally made the decisions. All honorable mentions are award winning pieces.

Sylvia Goulden, the CAA president, invited me to serve as a juror. This is the third time for me in 30 years. It is my honor and privilege to serve as your juror. Thanks to all the volunteers in CAA, their work made my job easier.

Congratulations to all the award winner artists who chose excellent work to enter the competition.

Thanks to all the entry artists who chose very good work to enter the show.

A big thank you to all the artists, to Pennie Fien (exhibits chair), Sylvia H. Goulden (president and exhibitis co-chair), Katherine Chang Liu (juror), and the staff of the Betsy Lueke Creative Arts Center (the hosts who hung the exhibit) for making "Pushing Boundaries" such a success. The in-person show consists of 86 works by 65 artists. A few works could not be shipped, but all 91 accepted pieces can be seen online by clicking the published shows button at onlinejuriedshows.com. About one-third of all artworks were from out-of-area and were shipped in, befitting an organization which became truly pan-American during the pandemic.

The exhibit exceeds the sum of its small-works parts, showing a variety of techniques and points-ofview. Some viewers even brought magnifying glasses to see the pieces up close. The reception was lively, CAA's first in-person event in over three years. Two award winners, Patrice Gelband from northern California and Jennifer Robertson from Seattle, traveled a great many miles to our southern Californian locale.

A video of the reception will be posted to our website, collageartists.org, by mid-May.







Andrea Burgay is a visual artist from Syracuse, NY, currently living and working in Brooklyn, NY. Her work combines collage, sculpture and found materials to elevate the overlooked and the mundane via transformative physical processes. Through a process of adding and removing layers of handmade and collected materials she presents a physical manifestation of the passage of time, destruction and decay, with a sense of potential renewal.

She has exhibited widely nationally and internationally. Her most recent one-person show was *Everything Coming Together and Falling Apart*, Roxbury Arts Group, Walter Meade Gallery, Roxbury, NY

Burgay is also founder and editor of *Cut Me Up*, a participatory collage magazine and curatorial project. Each issue presents a curated selection of original mixed-media artworks, intended for readers to deconstruct, and transform into new artworks.






