The juror will be **Kristine Schomaker** (she/her) an artist, art historian, curator, publisher and mentor living and working in Los Angeles, California. She earned her BA in Art History and MA in Studio Art from California State University at Northridge. In 2014 Kristine founded Shoebox Arts aimed at helping artists gain a presence in the art world.

Kristine has started critique meet-ups, runs an alternative art space and is an art activator for the organization Artists Thrive. She is also the publisher of Art and Cake, a contemporary L.A. Art magazine and has curated numerous art exhibitions throughout Southern California. Her mission is to create community among artists and the art world in order to help each other thrive. Exhibiting her work since the late 1990's, Kristine has been featured in numerous solo and group exhibitions. The deadline is Sunday October 1, 2023 11:59 PDT.

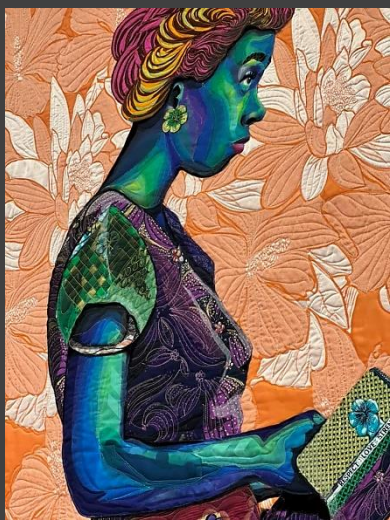
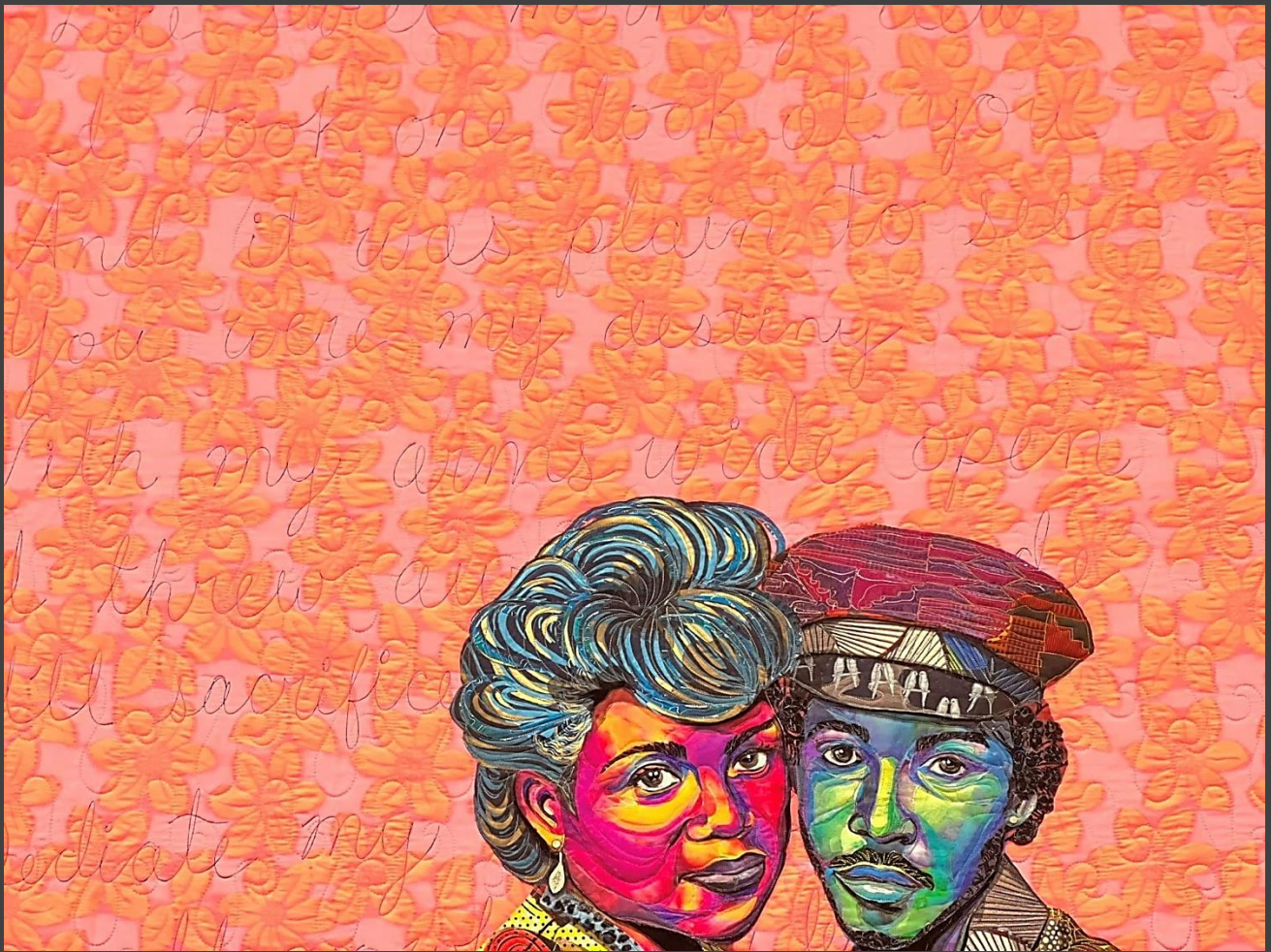

NEWSPAPER ARTICLE: documentary about the Kensington Storefront, Philadelphia

About 260 people came to watch the premiere of “Art of Survival,” a short film that documents life at the Kensington Storefront. Originally an empty retail space at 2774 Kensington Ave., the storefront . . . opened in 2017 and became known as a haven for arts programming and community healing until its closure in early 2020. Co-directors Tony Heriza, Val Keller, and Jim Wasserman of Hidden River Films were initially drawn to the idea of telling a story of hope in a Philadelphia neighborhood infamous for its drug usage.

“I have no idea why we even have conversations about why art matters. Because if you have an artist at the table, something changes . . . When it comes to big issues ... the creative path can sometimes get us out of where we were. And now when you see this film, you will see that art ignites change and transformation.” –Jane Golden, executive director of Mural Arts Philadelphia

“My small messy studio at the Providence Club shows that I’ve worked in many different media. . . . The most rewarding for me has been my collage work which I describe as “a fanciful view of a realistic subject.” It’s not abstract, I recreate an image by using quite varied pieces of paper, often chosen for their relevance to the subject of the collage. The pieces are rarely just a solid color, they have mixtures, tones, textures, words and interesting variety. I have piles of magazines in my studio, and when working on a collage, the surfaces in my studio are full of torn and sorted pieces of paper, and I usually know where everything is.”

Vera also says: I am now a Signature Member of the National Collage Society and can add the letters NCS to my name. Signature membership requires being juried into three of their annual shows, and my collages have been accepted in the shows in 2021, 2022 and 2023.”

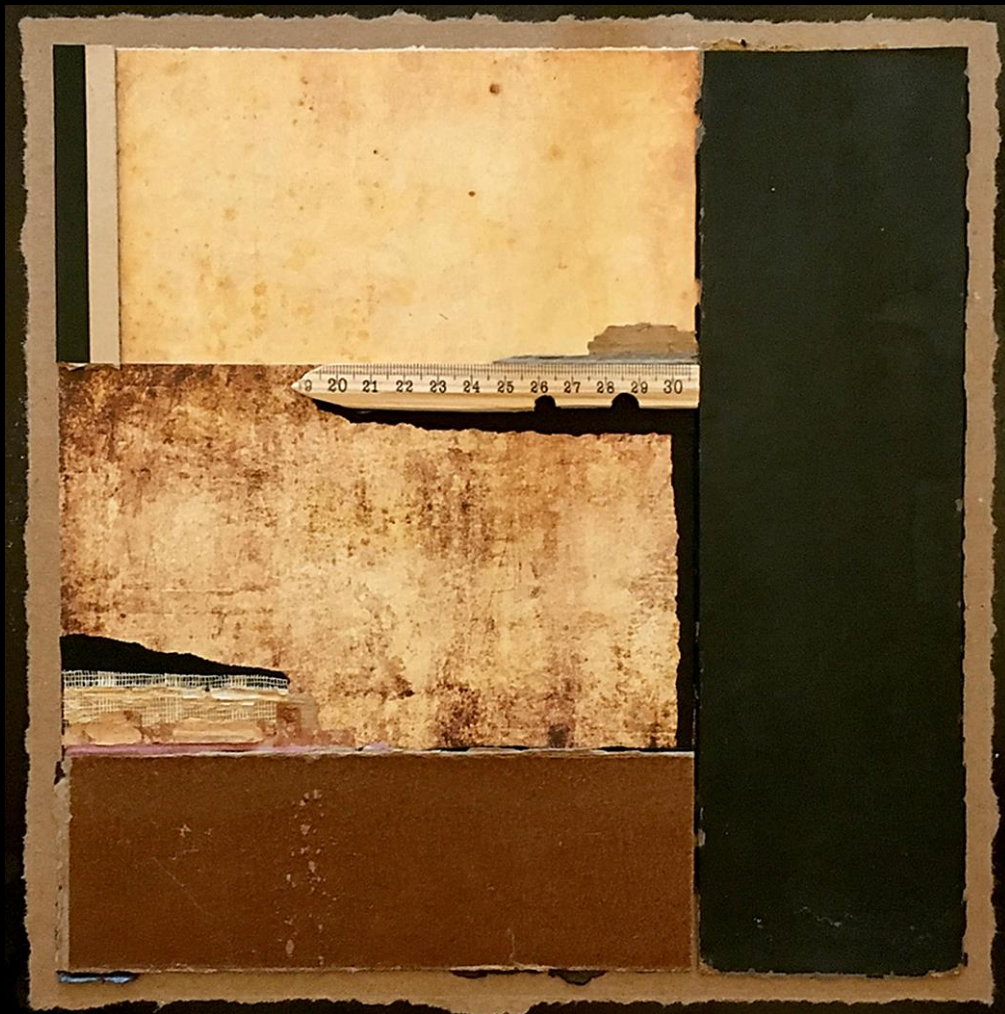

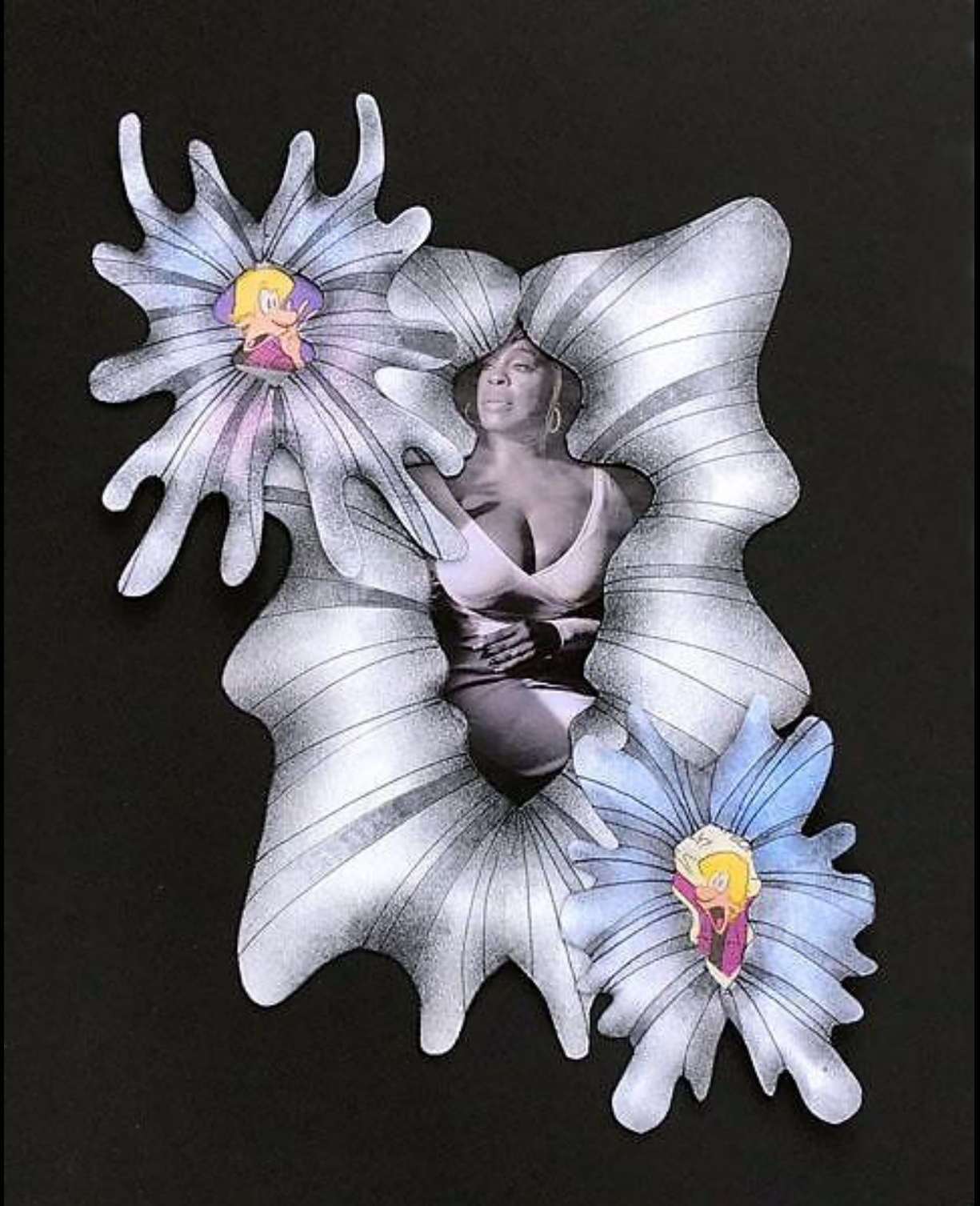

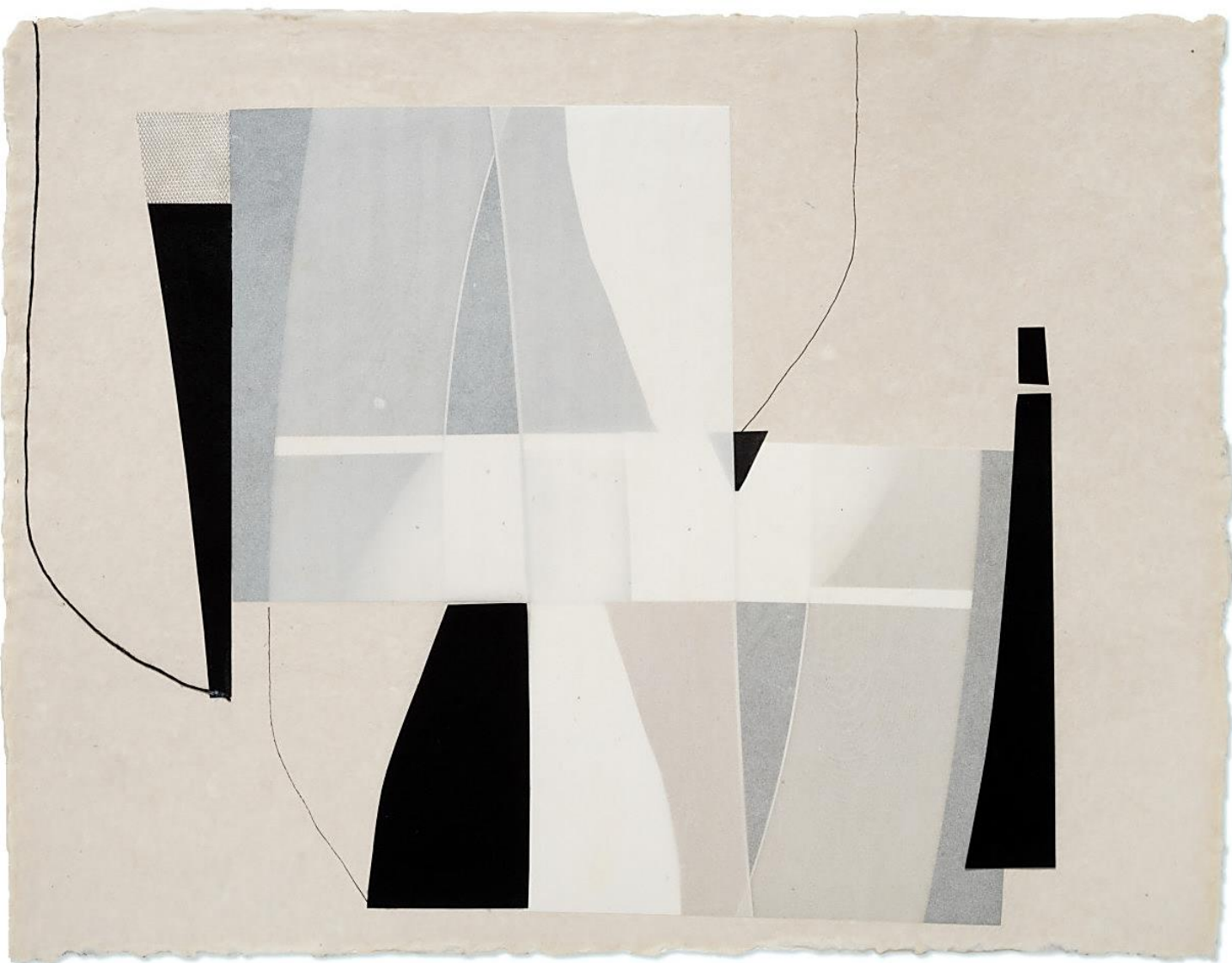

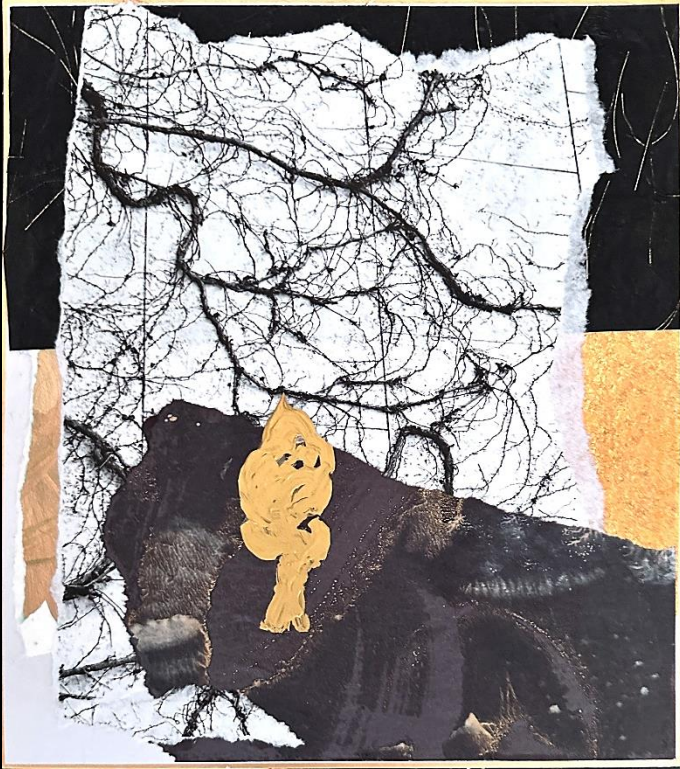

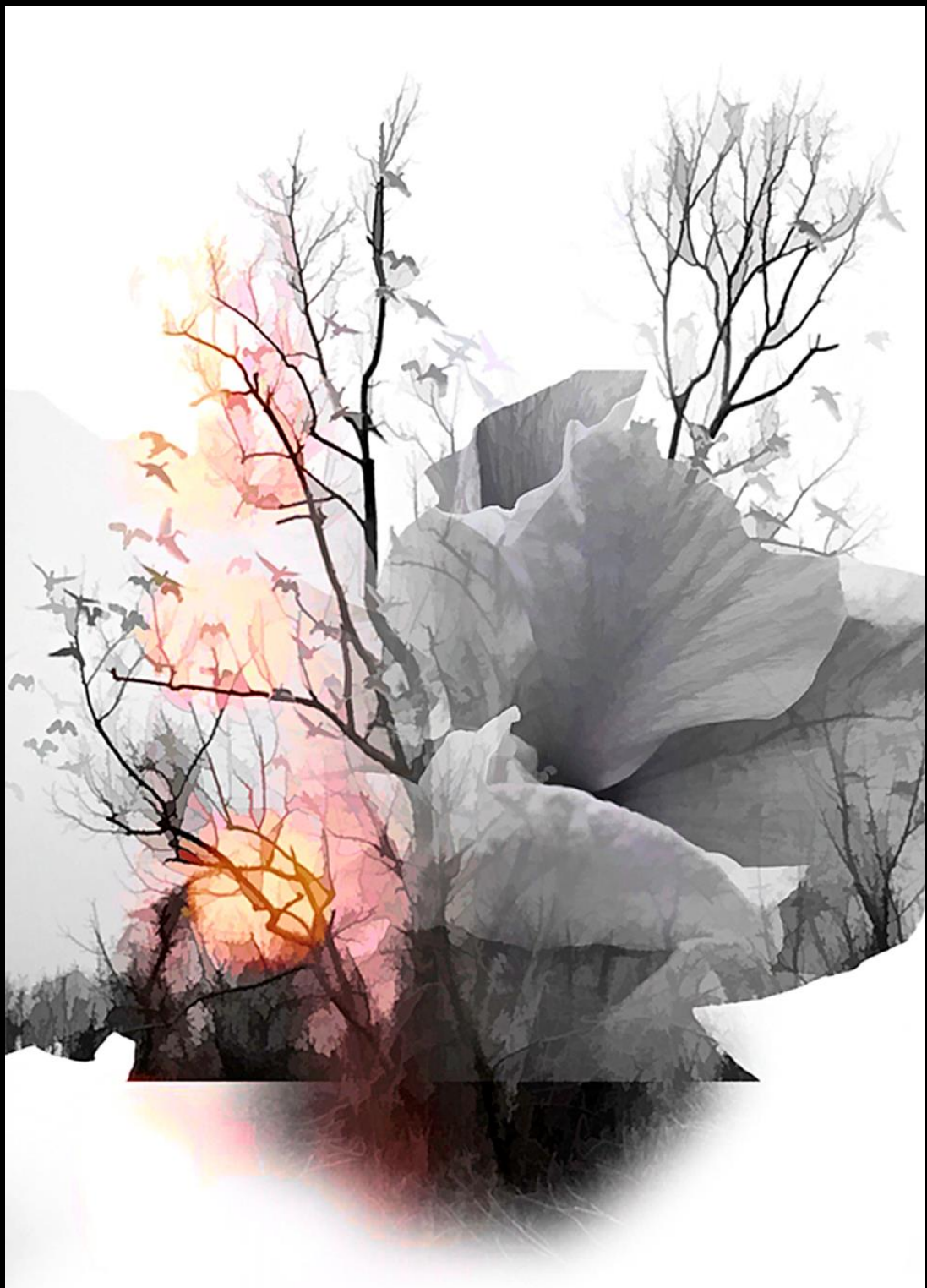

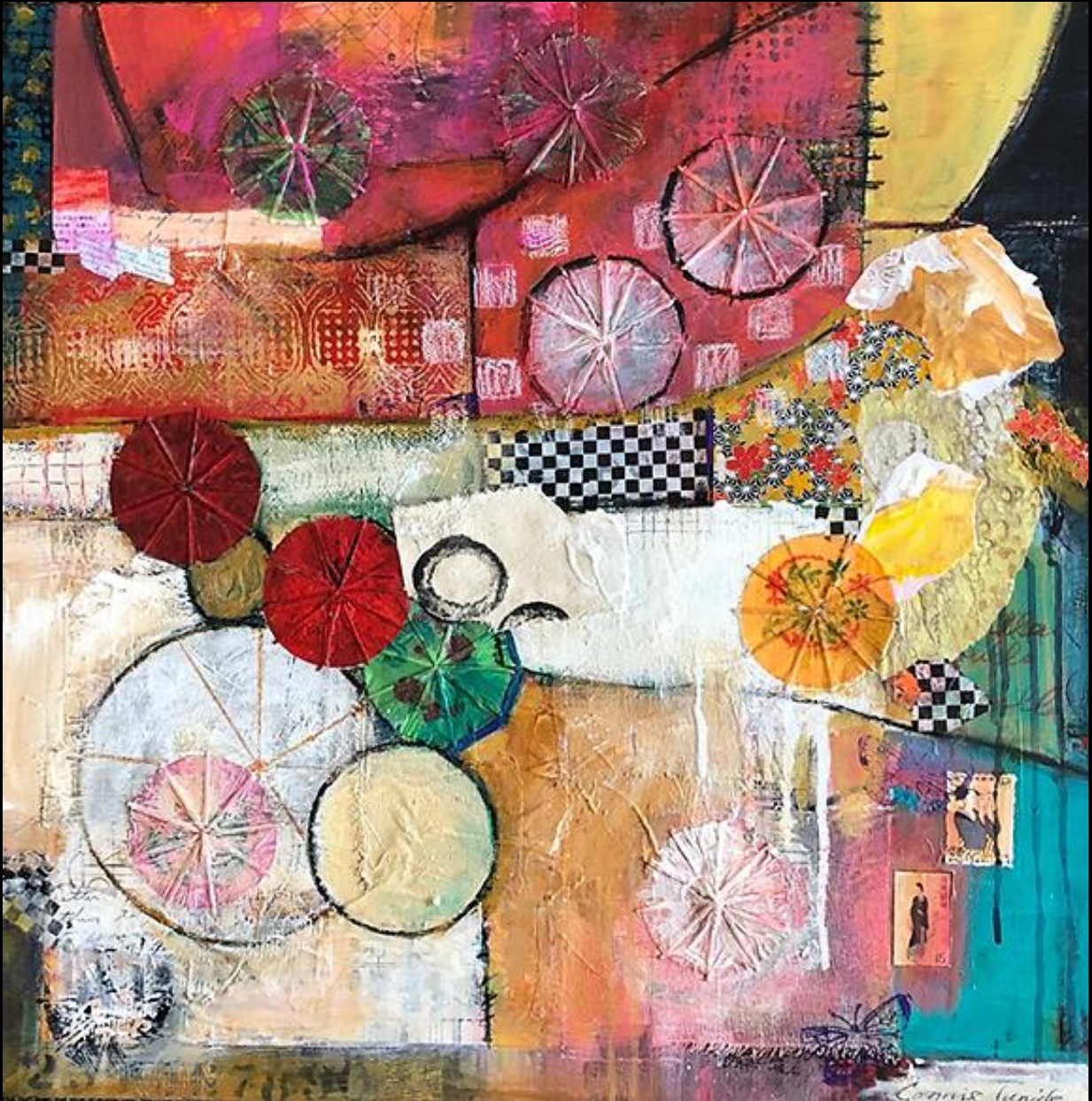

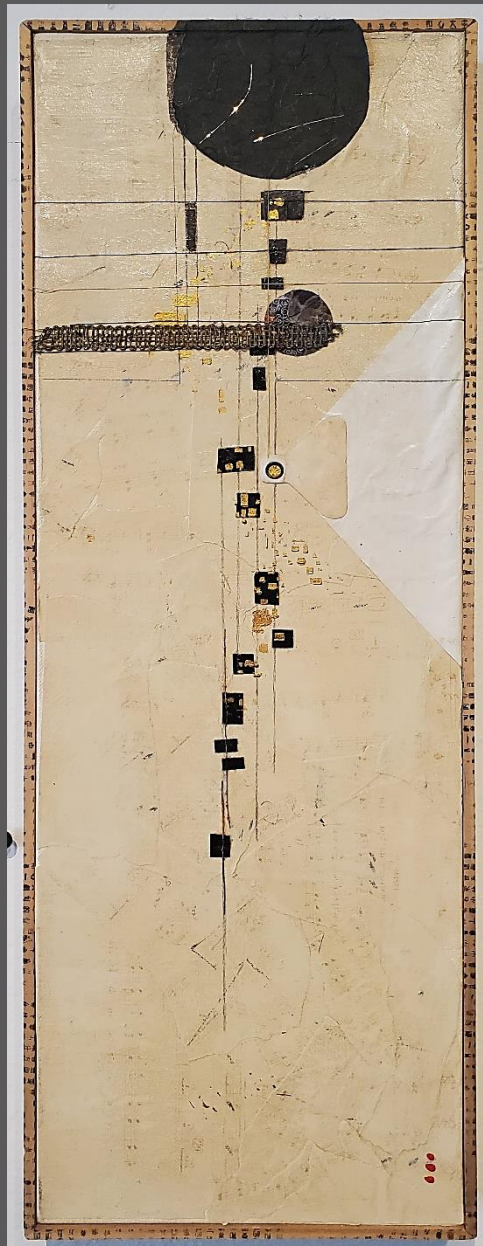

The burgeoning technological advance of AI and the debates around its impact on creative production, parallel the debate about photography and art raised when it was invented.

How does AI change the way we make, look at, and understand art? Can art be made by or with the aid of a non-human intelligence? Will art lose its inherent value because anyone with access to AI software can generate an image or is that concern a crass simplification of the possibilities AI has to offer to the creative world? Do you see it as transformative and terrifying or a bit of both? Has it made its way into your work? Are you re-committing to the hand-made? Or are you choosing an observant stance at least for now? We are looking for artists who are ready to tackle these questions in their work and want to participate in a larger exploration of AI by means of visual art.”
