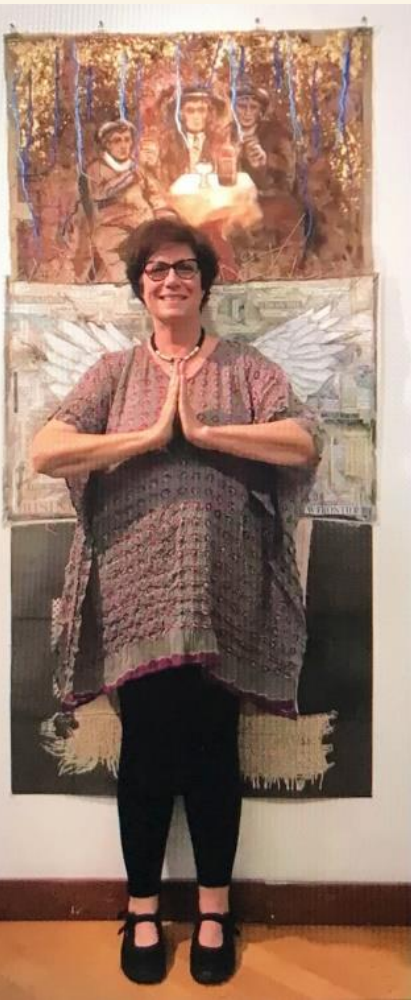

She was always the first one to step up and the last one to close the door. Our loss is profound. Susie passed away suddenly from a massive cerebral hemorrhage and fortunately suffered no pain. She was president of Collage Artists of America 2004-2006 and again 2014-2016. She gave the first zoom presentation as a featured speaker in September 2020 and led a Hundertwasser-inspired workshop in June 2021.

NOVEMBER ZOOM: ROXANE HOLLOSI

During her formative years in the mid-west, Roxane Hollosi became immersed in Native American spirituality and the natural world. These influences have carried her through a lifetime of artmaking. She is now based in Atlanta and creates daring, large-scale multimedia installations as well as more intimate works.

Her work is about the energies she feels and sees at the moment of creating. "You can't create in the past, and you can't create in the future," she says, "you really have to create right in the moment."

An acquisition of three large pieces in 2018 by Fulton County and Keisha Lance Bottoms (then-Mayor of Atlanta), launched Roxane's art business, and now her art supports itself. These are dimensional works of acrylic on paper, mounted on board, with collaged elements, including thick, strong roofing paper. From left to right above: *I Hear the Feet Approaching 1*, *Freedom*, and *I Hear the Feet Approacheng 2*



Early experiments ca. 1990 with tapestrylike handmade paper made use of old cotton clothing and printmaking. Roxane works on several pieces at once, with variations on a theme.



Honeybees inspired a ten-work series, Symbiosis. Roxane wanted to break out of the rectangle, so she ripped and shaped paper.



An assemblage with hexagonal, decorated fabric pieces mounted in a bodice continues the honeybee theme.



Round pieces make up the ten-work series, Vanishing Worlds. A collaged surface was used as a map-canvas, and endangered species images like whales and raptors were added on top via sewing and drawing. The works are presented in plexiglass frames as if floating.

BREATHE—During the pandemic, the artist did several series called Breathe: paper collages, piece paintings with mostly fabric, and 6-foot paintings. A Fulton County grant helped finance her work and a catalog. The breathe theme originated during Covid, where the word had many meanings that came together -- symptoms of the disease, the George Floyd “I can’t breathe” murder, the plastics suffocating our oceans.



A paper collage series was made early in the pandemic. Pieces are 20" x20" to signify the year 2020. Incorporated into the collage somewhere is the word “Breathe.” Paper collages start with a shape, pattern, or size. Then Roxane builds on them and glues, tacks, and sews elements.



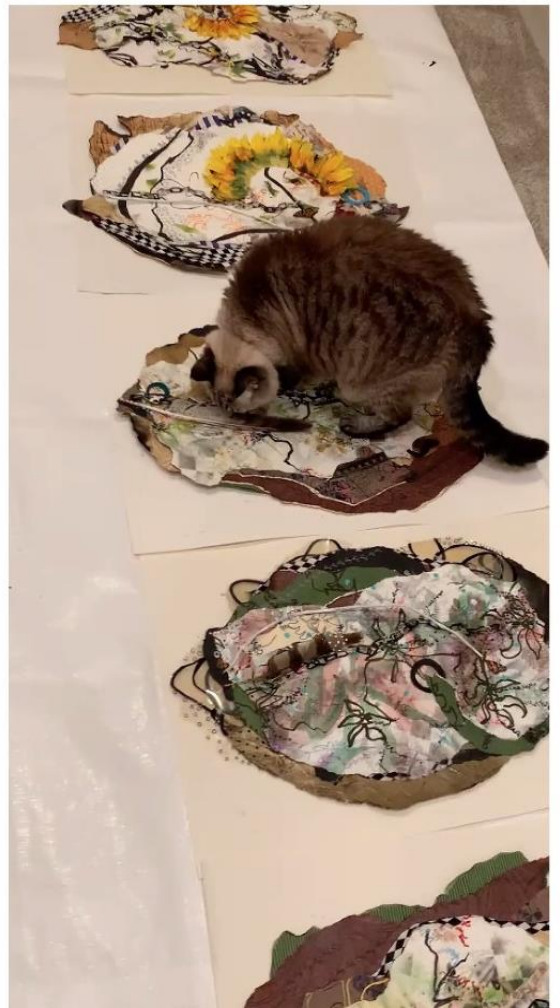
A piece paintings series was made mostly from fabric, with writing of the word “Breathe.” Pieces are 20 x20 inches



The artist uses repurposed trash plastic, and here she created wings.



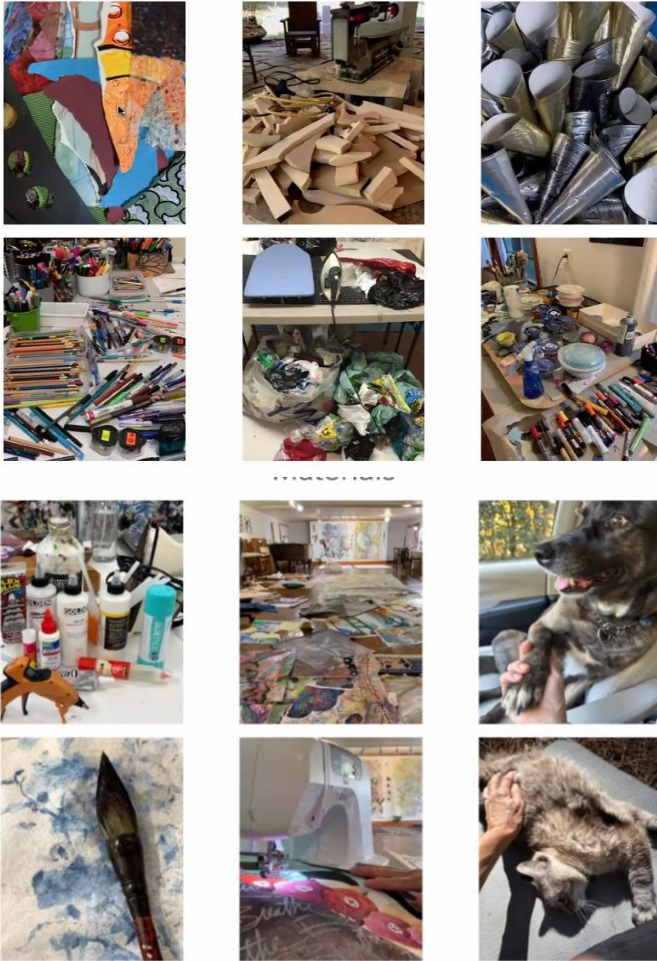
This large piece, *Searching for a New Way to Breathe*, was exhibited in 2022 at the EYP Gallery100 in Atlanta. It has a spine made of wood pieces with some Native-American-inspired jingle cones for healing, and also lacelike plastic wings.



The pieces in Roxane's recent series, *Habitat*, are about 22 x 28 inches. She has created habitats, which are ideally supposed to be healthy. On the left she incorporated branches and chains and burned the edges, like the widespread wildfires of the day. On the right are pieces in the series in progress, and her cat on top of one.

TIPS AND TRICKS: ROXANE HOLLOSI

Materials



Materials (left) include ripped up old works and found paper, wood, jingle cones made from cans, drawing materials, pencils, markers, a household iron, a variety of adhesives including glue sticks, Weldbond glue, and matte medium, old acrylic paintings to be repurposed, paint, and very importantly, a sewing machine. Also her cat and dog.

Roxane uses her i-phone to take many of her pictures. There was a period of adjustment while she transitioned from her old film camera, but now she's all in.

Titles are important to her. She uses them as a jumping off point, something to ponder.

Plastic is durable, yet she sometimes uses wood, which is degradable. Concern over non-archival materials can get in the way of creativity, so decisions on what to use are a balancing act.

Grommets are used to hang pieces, to hold pieces together, and to serve as visual design elements.

PLASTIC (left): Roxane starts with ordinary household plastic like supermarket bags, fruit mesh, and bottles. She cuts and manipulates them to make shapes for her installations. She does not recolor the plastic, the colors are in essence like acrylic paint. She then quickly melts the plastic, between parchment, with a household iron.
