BARBARA TABACHNICK



BARBARA TABACHNICK is a longtime CAA member and outstanding mixed-media collage artist. She considers herself an experimental artist, always asking, "What will happen if...?"

Barbara began taking painting and drawing classes in the late '50s while pursuing her undergraduate education in psychology and continued into the mid-'60s while working as a research associate. She painted throughout graduate school in psychology at UCLA and as a professor at California State University Northridge, where she taught perception, statistics and research design. Then, in 1976, Barbara fell under the spell of belly dancing and its accompanying costume design and construction. So much for painting...

Dancing and costuming remained her focus until the early '90s when writing, consulting, skiing and so many other things (not to mention age) took over. Now a retired professor and published author, Barbara has returned to the easel while continuing to consult and revise her books. In 2012, she was honored to receive the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Western Psychological Association.



Barbara enjoys the process of making art. She didn't stop asking "what if?" as she pushed paint around or allowed the computer to play with her images. Her identity straddles science and art, and her art is all about playing with nature. Trees, landscapes, cityscapes and architecture are wonderful in their original forms but she enjoys discovering what fun it is to let the computer play with them, noting that interactions between computers and artists can make fascinating art. Barbara states that her "background in the study of human perception helps her appreciate the visual ambiguities in shifting figure and ground, which I sometimes find creeping into my work."

Barbara Tabachnick is a member of Collage Artists of America, California Art League, Southern California Women's Caucus for Art and Lantern of The East, Los Angeles. She is represented in the Slide Registry of the LA Department of Cultural Affairs, participated for many years in Experimental Artists of Los Angeles and was twice invited to exhibit at Ontario International Airport. Barbara is an award-winning artist who has exhibited widely in a variety of solo and juried shows in Southern California, Monterey Bay, Japan and the Philippines.
